Medications to Stop Before Surgery

Consult your primary care physician prior to stopping any medications. However, please review the following medications with your internist. Following are guidelines that we recommend:

14 days before surgery (or more, if tolerated):

• Any narcotic (Vicodin, Norco, Percocet, Oxycontin, etc)

10 days before surgery:

- Plavix
- Any Non-steroidal Anti-Inflammatory Drug (NSAID): Aspirin, Motrin, Aleve, Ibuprofen, Mobic
 - Exception: Celebrex
- Any herbal supplement
- Vitamins E, C or K

7 days before surgery:

- Aspirin
- Coumadin

You may continue to take the following medications:

• Tylenol, Celebrex, Ultracet, Glucosamine

On the morning of surgery:

- You may take your normal medications ONLY WITH A SIP OF WATER
- If you use an inhaler, please bring it with you to the hospital
- If you are taking diabetic medications, you should check with your primary care physician to determine if you should take your medications on the morning of surgery
